As sponsor of all school organizations, the S. A. A. has concluded a year worthy of recognition.

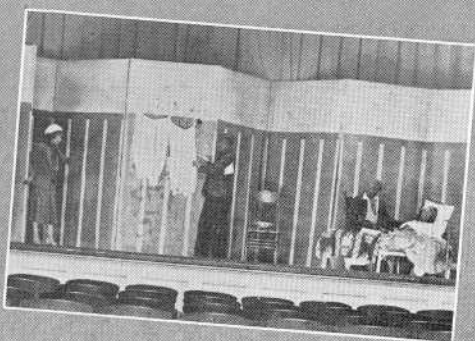

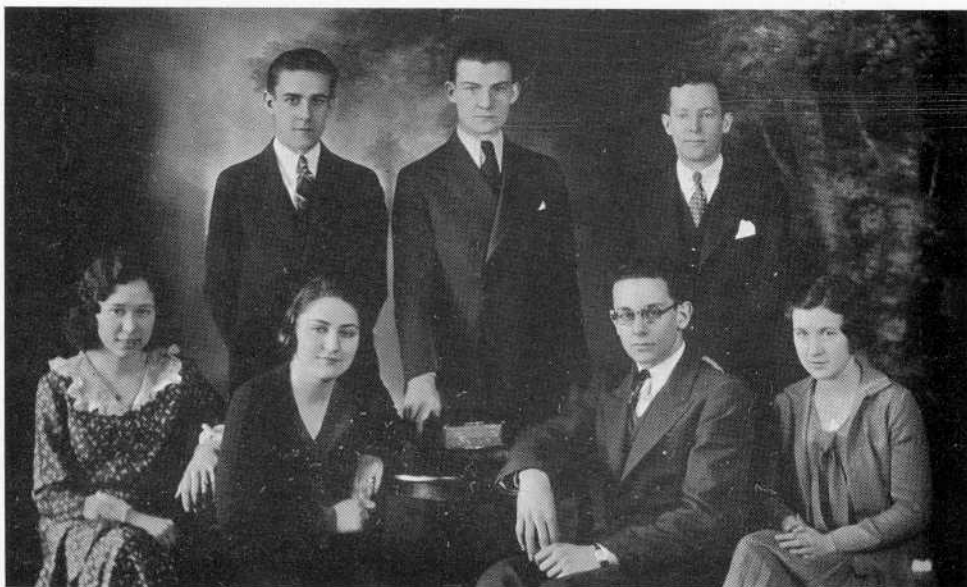

Altogether, the work of the young club has been instructive and helpful to a student pursuing the electrical course.

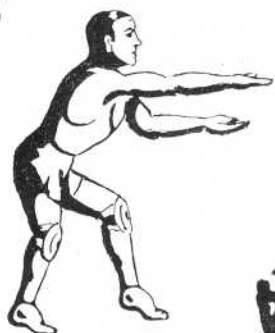

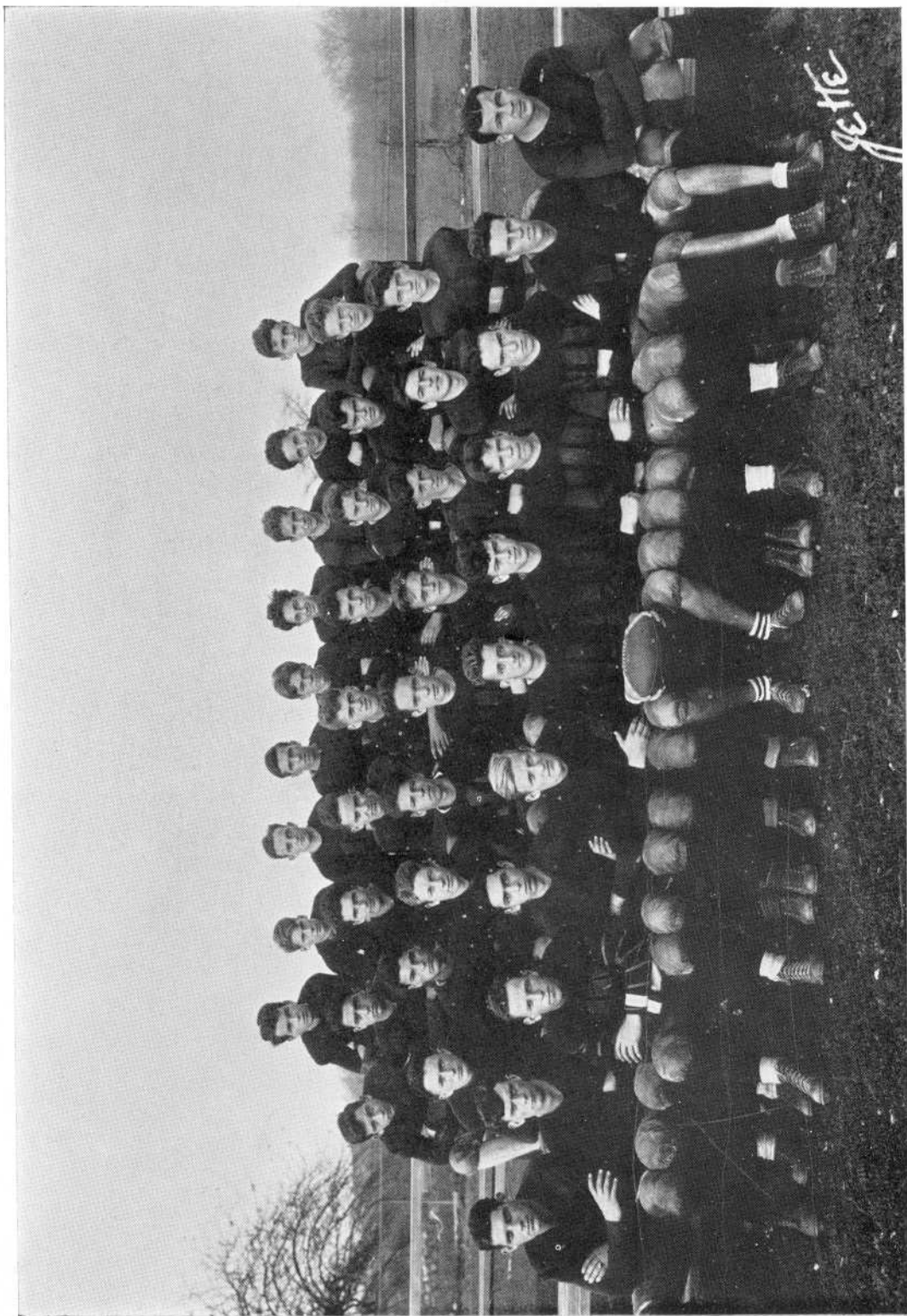

FOOTBALL TEAM

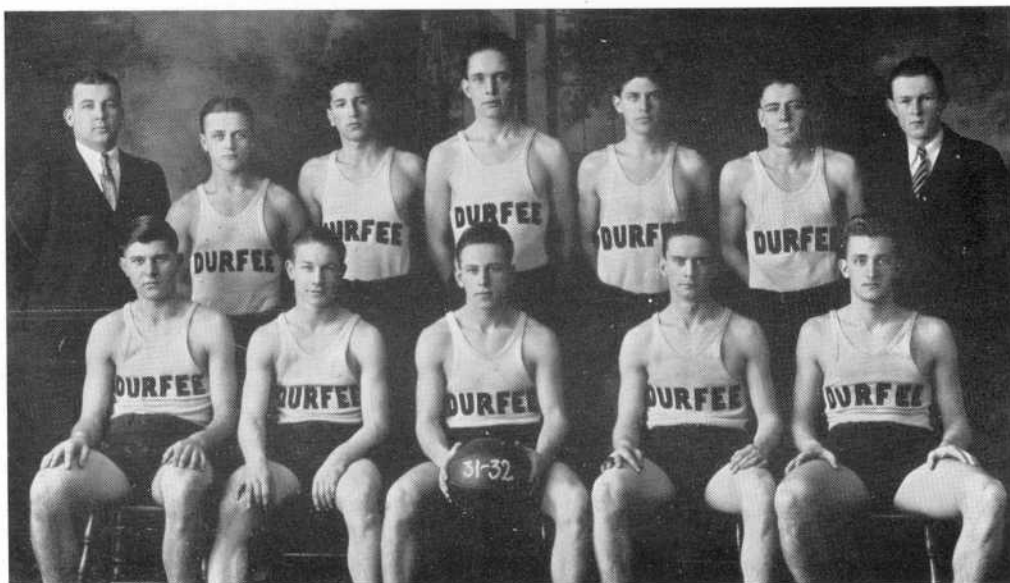
