Under the advisorship of Mr. John F. Sullivan, the German Club promises a year of culture and entertainment for those students who join.





### GIRLS' ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION








Other contributions were made by Kevin Manning, a hustling forward, two fine shooting guards, Frank Bigos and Tom Costa, and a fine group of reserves.


