We had common questions, doubts and dreams. Anxiously we prepared ourselves for our exit, working as a team, working as a class.

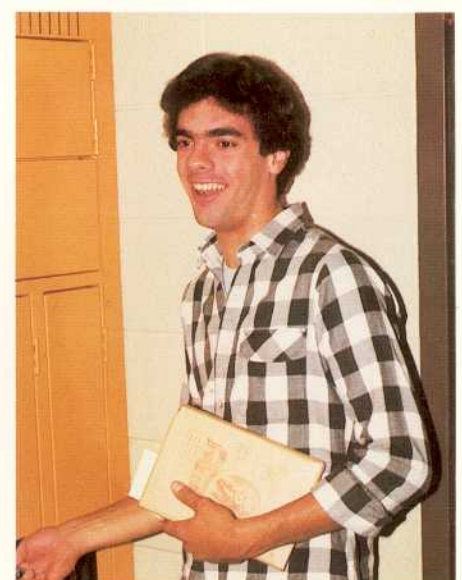




We Understood Each Other

The school echoed with our joyfulness. Teasing and joking with each other, our academic load was lightened while our personal problems were put on hold.





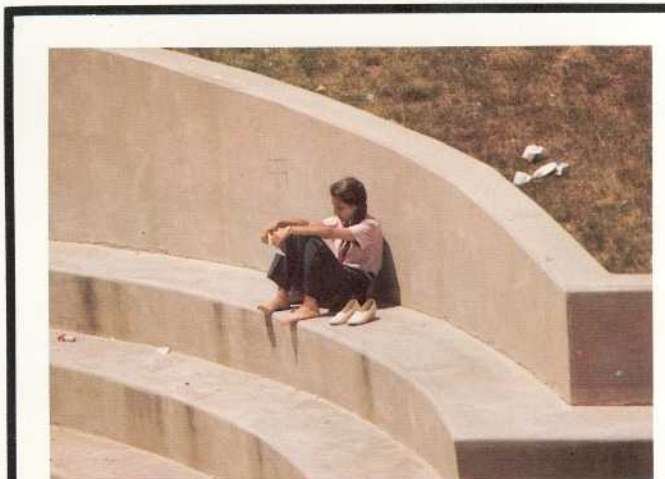
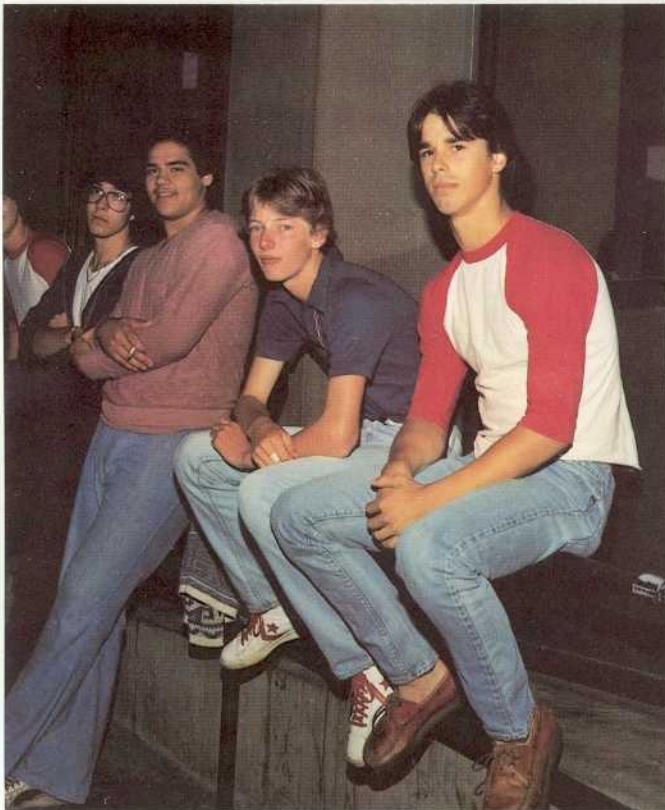

school day friends.

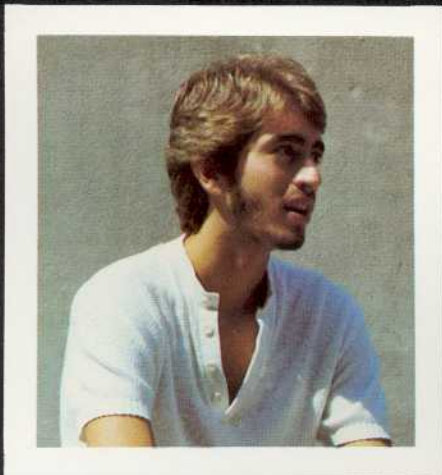
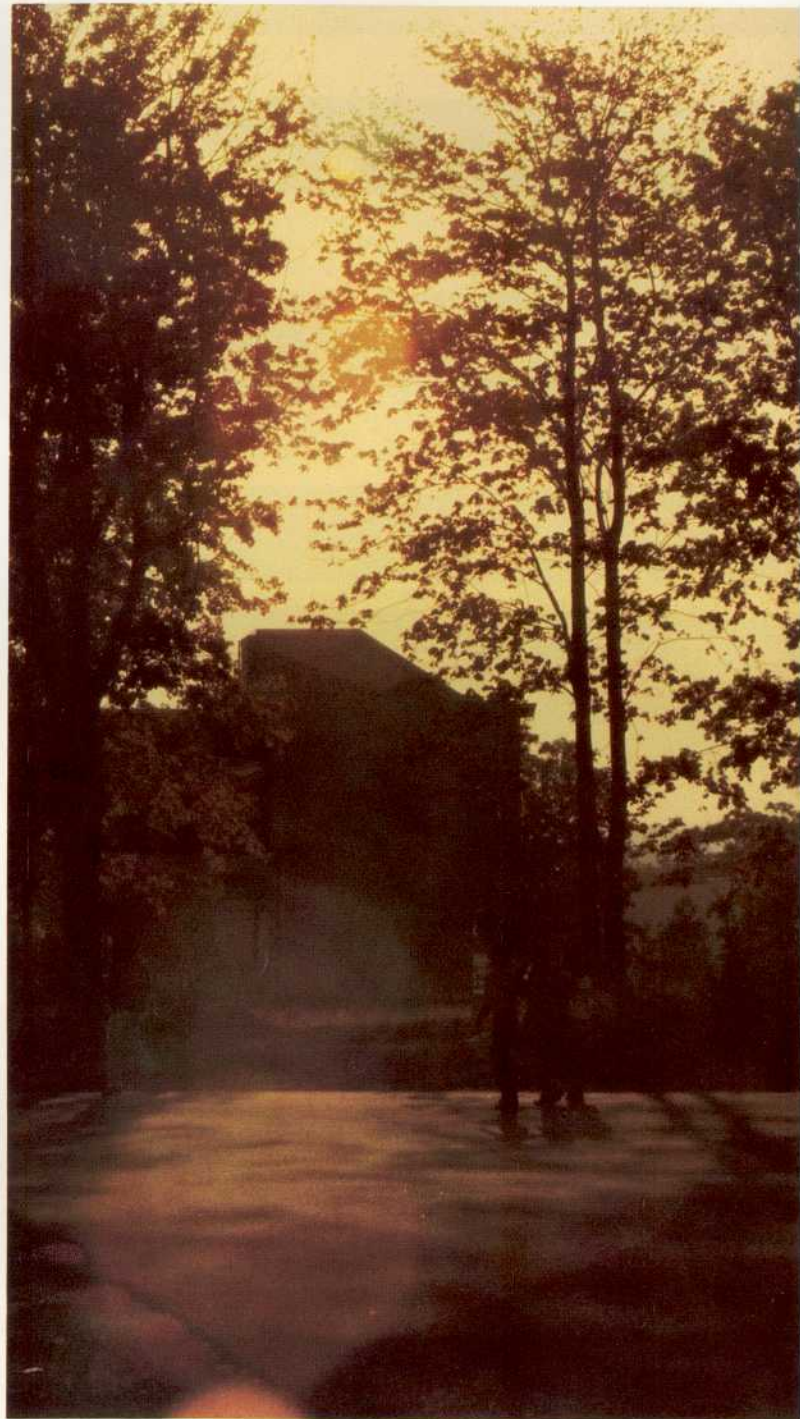

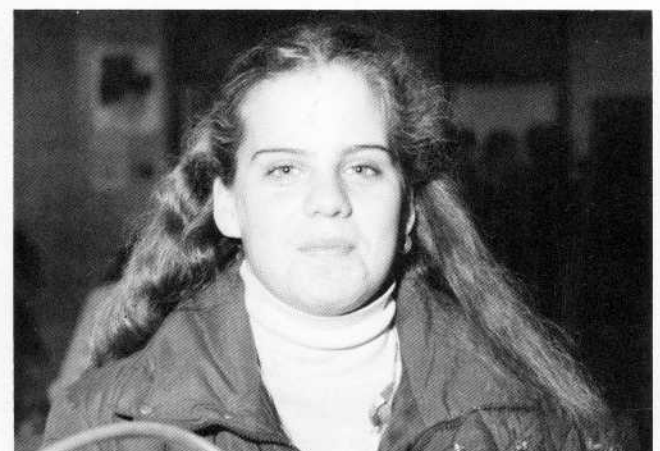


Our Freshman Year 1978 - 1979

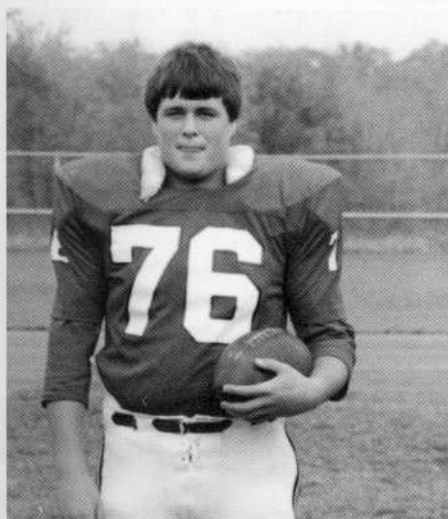
Football

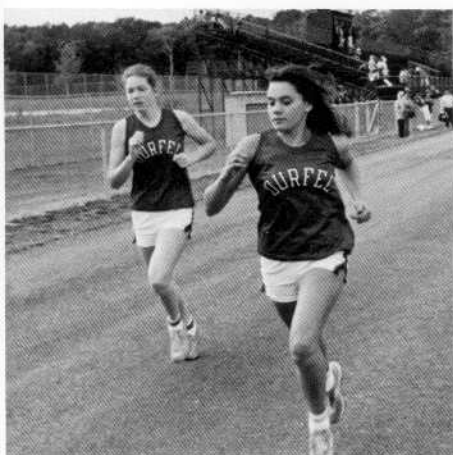
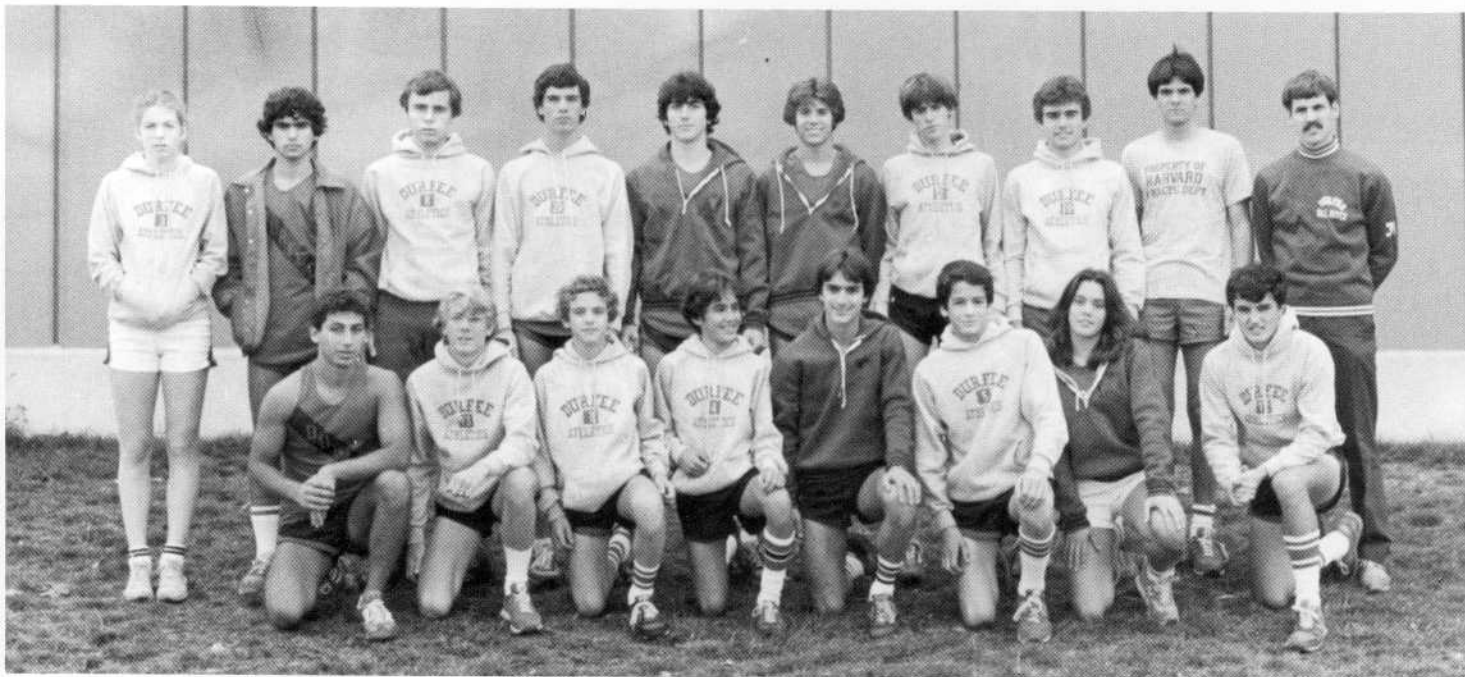
Cross Country

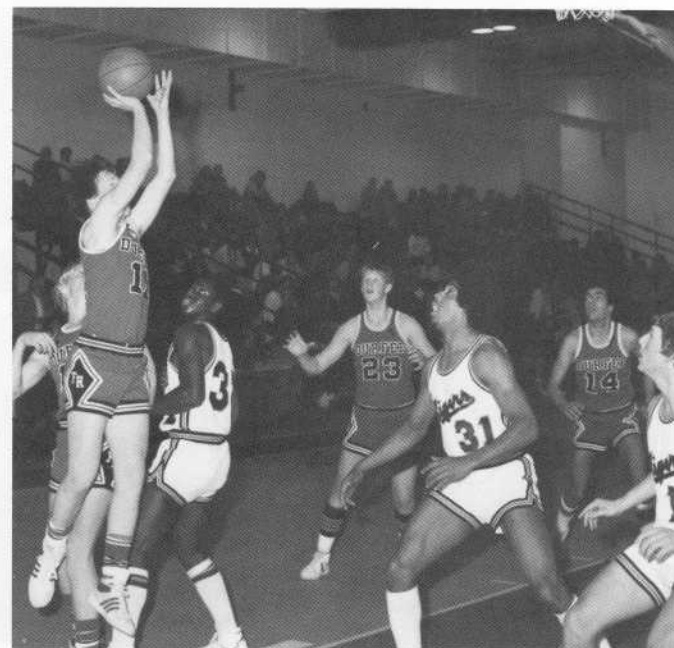
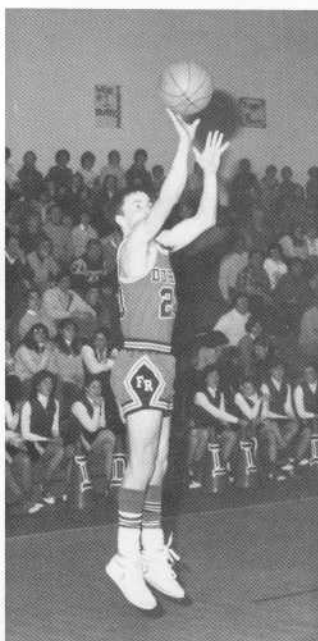
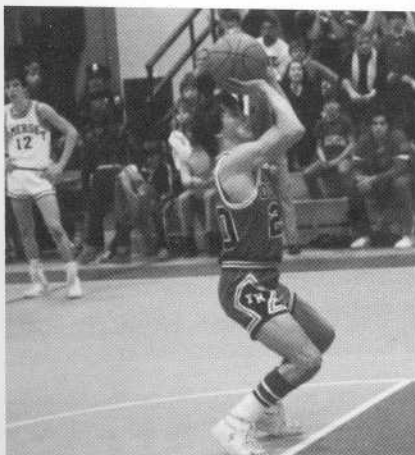


Although young and with best years to come, the 1982-83 Boys' Varsity Basketball team finished the season with an overall record of 15 wins and 5 losses.

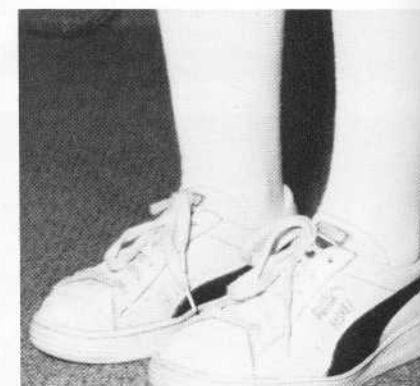
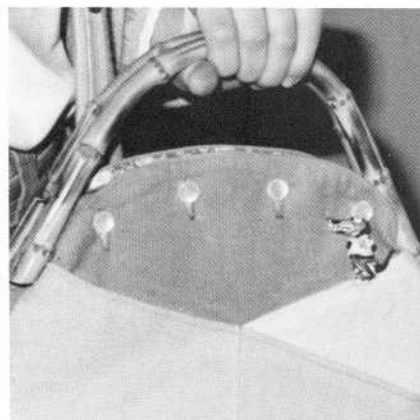


High School Attire . . . A Variety Of Styles

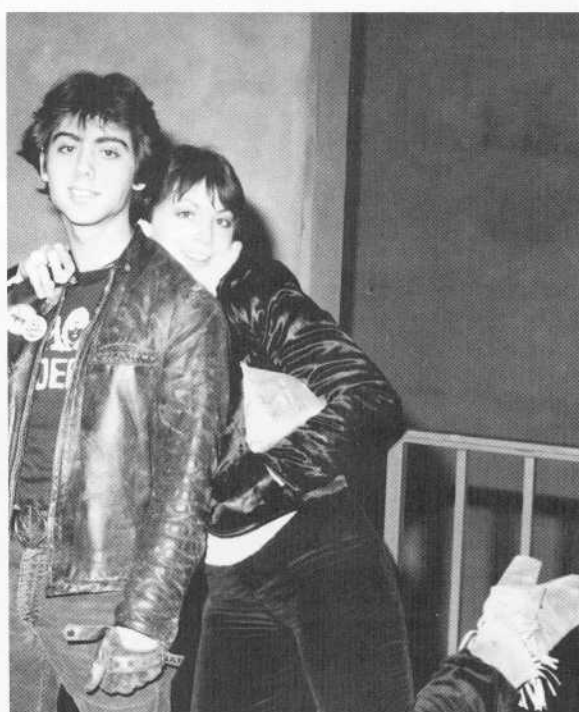
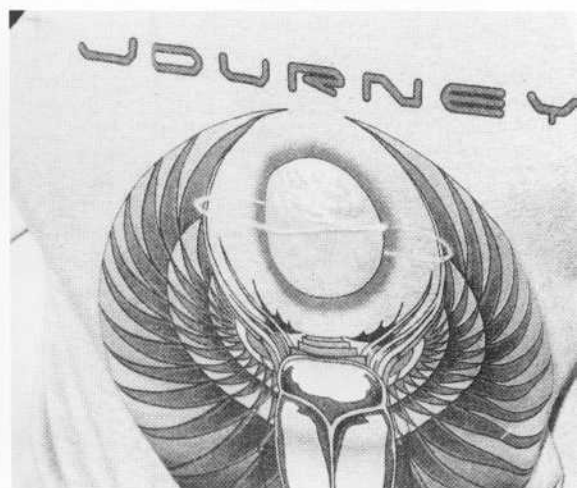

The "punk" look resembled the music, loud and strong. Flourescent colors and large, dominant patterns were characteristic of the style.

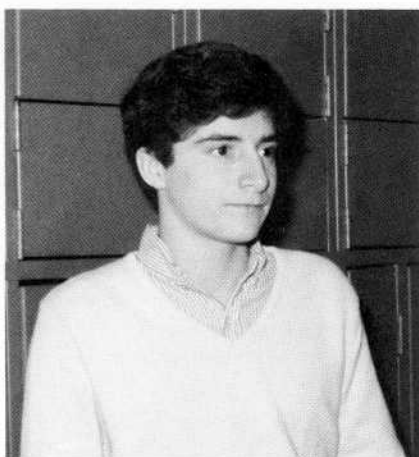

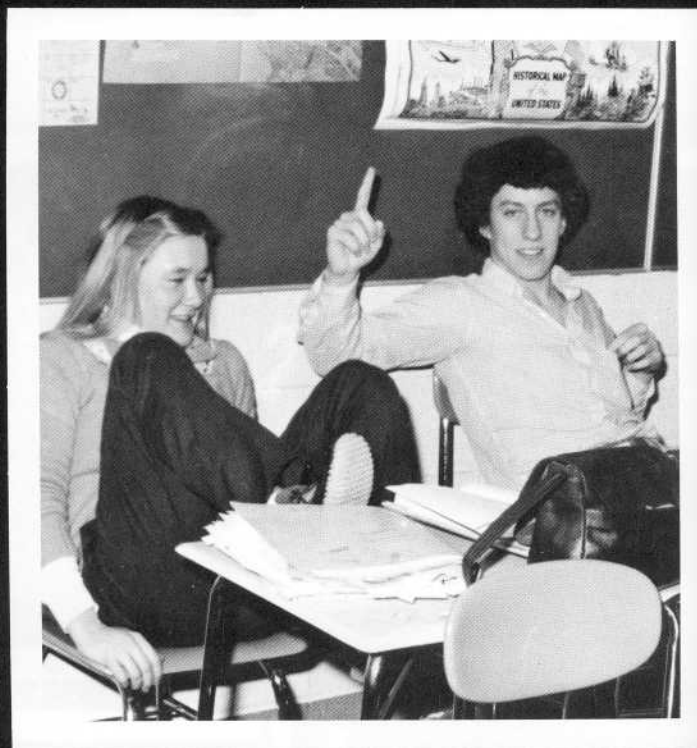
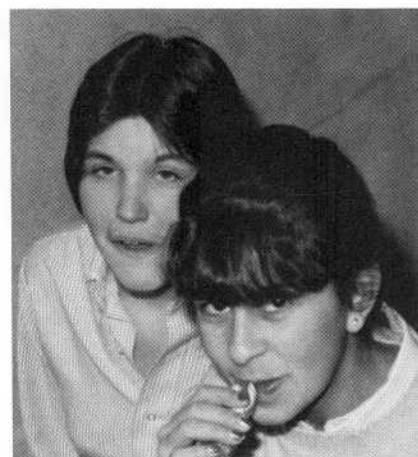

Although changes in fashion were common, most students frequently returned to the Levis and Nike tennis shoes for every day wear.

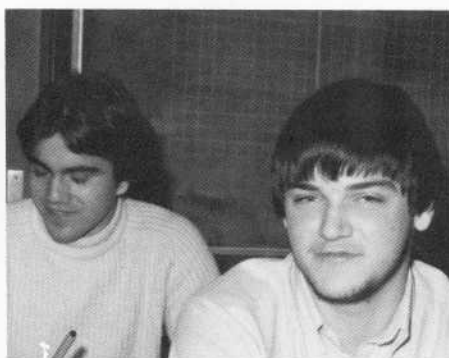

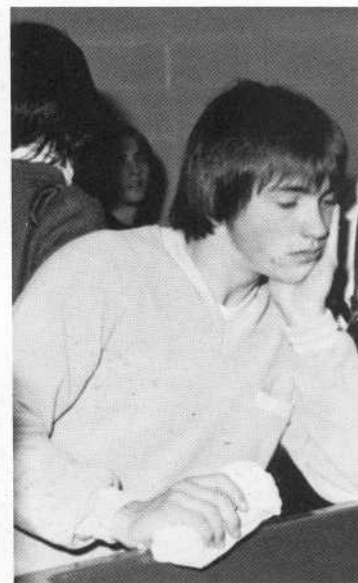


Adolescents Being Treated As Adults
